In seven years, CSC's Resource Development Department (RD) has helped bring over \$8 million worth of funding into Linn, Benton and Lincoln counties from a variety of sources. These resources have supported CSC departmental missions and other non-profit missions. RD staff has worked with a variety of organizations, funders and agencies. Types of support raised and proposals funded include capacity building, capital requests for materials and equipment, operating grants for emergency food services, employment and training services, affordable housing, community facility development, environmental causes and others.

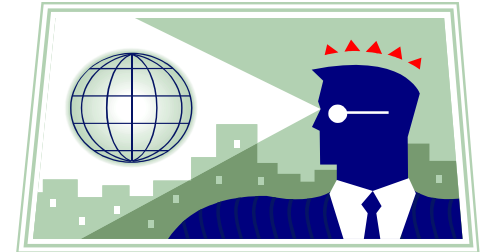

From time to time, all organizations find themselves in need of assistance. If your organization could use technical expertise, CSC's experienced and professional development staff can assist you in your efforts. We will work with you or your team to develop capacity in:

Grant writing

which can include :

- Reviewing overall organizational information including strategic planning documents, vision and mission statements, and program data.
- Reviewing past proposals and/or grants.
- Gathering needed information in face-to-face meetings and by phone conferencing.
- Researching data pertinent to the agency to develop your case and reinforce your needs statement.
- Preparing and editing narratives, creating templates, and drafting cover letters.
- Completing required application forms and drafting cover letters.

Private Foundation/Donor Research

- Identifying the type and sources of funding an organization is seeking for support.
- Categorizing areas of interest.
- Researching and generating lists of potential

funders and identifying community-based resources including companies and individuals.

- Developing the capacity of board members to work effectively with private donors and private and corporate foundations.
- Conducting and preparing impact statements and other special assignments requiring research.
- Planning for and evaluating existing and new services and programs.

Project Development

- Special program or project development services including pre-implementation planning, start-up, operations and post-program evaluation services.
- Planning for and identifying strategies targeting program or project sustainability.

Organizational Development

- Creating strategic planning documents, vision and mission statements.
- Providing on-call executive analysis and problem-solving.
- Developing outcomes and performance measures.
